# EMAS Vandalism - Overview

- Damage to the Engineered Materials Arresting System (EMAS) was discovered on March 10, 2020.
- The damage was inflicted by a vehicle.
- The matter is under investigation by the Bridgeport Police Department.
- 230 blocks and 11 shields must be replaced based on the Manufacturer's inspection.
- The vehicle was not heavy enough to break through the tops, but significant damage occurred to the internal structure of the blocks.
- A claim was submitted to under the City's insurance policy.

# EMAS Vandalism – Initial Response

- An internal investigation was conducted.
- The Airport and tenants have cooperated with and supported the Police Department's investigation.
- Vehicle access limited to the greatest extent possible while the investigations are in process.
- Fencing improvements were completed.

# EMAS Vandalism - Next Steps

- Determine insurance coverage.
- Identify additional repair funding sources.
- Complete purchase agreements with manufacturer.
- Bid installation services.
- Continue to support Police Department investigation.
- Continue to improve surveillance and make additional fencing improvements, when able.
- Evaluate and revise, as necessary, long-term vehicle access privileges and processes.
