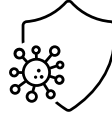




# City of Bridgeport COVID-19 Guidelines

## COVID-19 VACCINE ELIGIBILITY\*



- All individuals who are 12 years of age or older and live, work, or attend school in Connecticut are eligible to receive the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine.
- All individuals who are 18 years of age or older and live, work, or attend school in Connecticut are eligible to receive the Moderna and J&J COVID-19 vaccine.

## MASK AND FACE COVERING REQUIREMENTS\*



As of May 19, 2021, Connecticut's protocols regarding masks and face coverings were updated to align with the recently modified CDC recommendations. Businesses, state, and local government offices have the option to require masks to be worn by everyone in their establishments.

The protocols for the City of Bridgeport municipal buildings are as follows:

### Outdoors:

For all City of Bridgeport employees, masks are to be worn outside when contact is made with co-workers and residents for work purposes and six feet social distance is not possible.

### Indoors:

- Masks are required to be worn by everyone in certain settings such as healthcare facilities, facilities housing vulnerable populations, public and private transit, correctional facilities, schools, and childcare.
- Masks are to be worn completely covering the mouth and nose while walking throughout all building walkways or rooms outside of a cubicle or desk space (refer to [Employee Municipal COVID Guidelines](#)).
- Please note there will be no entry into a building wearing masks with exhalation valves which allow virus particles to escape, or face shields.

### DO choose masks that



Have two or more layers of washable, breathable fabric



Completely cover your nose and mouth



Fit snugly against the sides of your face and don't have gaps



Have a nose wire to prevent air from leaking out of the top of the mask
