## **MATTERS TO BE ACTED UPON:**

47-22 Budget and Appropriations Committee Report re: General Fund Budget a,b,c,d,e for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 – Votes as follows:

Council Member Burns said that the Committee had reviewed the budget carefully. Council Member Newton gave a brief overview of the process.

#### **General Fund:**

#### a. Revenue Increases

A 2/3rd majority was required.

- \*\* COUNCIL MEMBER BURNS MOVED TO APPROVE THE 2023-2024 GENERAL FUND REVENUE INCREASES FROM \$4,788,00 TO \$7,560,000.
- \*\* COUNCIL MEMBER NEWTON SECONDED.
- \*\* THE MOTION PASSED WITH ALL IN FAVOR, NONE OPPOSED AND NONE ABSTAINING.

#### **b.** Revenue Decreases

A simple majority vote was required.

\*\* COUNCIL MEMBER BURNS MOVED TO APPROVE THE 2023-2024 GENERAL FUND REVENUE DECREASES FROM \$8,200,250 TO \$5,062,760.

Council Member Herron spoke briefly about the move of the Department of Aging from the Health Department to Public Facilities.

- \*\* COUNCIL MEMBER NEWTON SECONDED.
- \*\* THE MOTION PASSED WITH ALL IN FAVOR, NONE OPPOSED AND NONE ABSTAINING.

Council Member Hodges joined the meeting at 6:21 p.m. There were now 15 Council Members present.

### c. Appropriation Increases

A 2/3rd majority was required.

- \*\* COUNCIL MEMBER BURNS MOVED TO APPROVE THE 2023-2024 GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS INCREASES FROM \$252,861,370 TO \$256,281,354.
- \*\* COUNCIL MEMBER NEWTON SECONDED.

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## \*\* THE MOTION PASSED WITH ALL IN FAVOR, NONE OPPOSED AND NONE ABSTAINING.

#### d. Appropriation Decreases

A simple majority vote was required.

- \*\* COUNCIL MEMBER BURNS MOVED TO APPROVE THE 2023-2024 GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS DECREASES FROM \$45,577,838 TO \$41,792,364.
- \*\* COUNCIL MEMBER NEWTON SECONDED.
- \*\* THE MOTION PASSED WITH ALL IN FAVOR, NONE OPPOSED AND NONE ABSTAINING.
  - e. General Fund Budget Fiscal Year 2023-2024 as amended.

Council Member McBride-Lee joined the meeting at 6:23 p.m. There were now 16 Council Members present.

A simple majority vote was required.

Council Member Newton thanked the Council Members for their cooperation. He then expressed his support for moving the Department of Aging back to the Public Facilities Department. He also said that the education of the children was being short changed.

Council Member Hodges agreed with Council Member Newton regarding the allocation for the Board of Education and the Bridgeport School District.

Council Member McBride-Lee reminded everyone that the BOE has control over their own finances. The Committee did the best that they could as far as the budget is concerned. She felt that this was a good budget. Everyone wants to give the BOE more money.

Council Member Herron said that the BOE deserves more money. During the last two years of COVID, many children arrived in this country that do not speak English. The number of SPED students has doubled. Everyone should be in contact with their State Representatives and
