

United, blessed, privileged, fearful, white and for too much of history, ignorant:

God Bless America... bountiful and beautiful.....sweet land of liberty...freedom... to assemble, speak and practice religion....and equal rights (initially white, literate men with property).....and

second chances for those from other lands who would work in the growing capitalist enterprise and hope for chances for an educated second generation?

Perhaps we know our family story and how and when it intersects those of other people with white skin particularly those from Western Europe. But do we know or have we reflected on those others who were initially present when the first Europeans landed and how the settlers dealt with those of color who were present? And the land was so fertile and large that more workers were required to make the land fruitful, especially in the Southern colonies (and States) so Africans captured were brought to the coasts for sale in chains, suffered the Middle Passage across the Atlantic, and about 8% of the 6 Million enslaved blacks were landed in the colonies/US before importation was made illegal in 1807, though slavery continued. By 1861 the number of blacks in the US had grown to about 4 Million people and perhaps 10% served in Northern or Southern armies during the Civil War with about 60,000 casualties.

After the Emancipation Proclamation 1863 and end of Civil War, 1865 plantations whose real wealth were humans indentured and controlled for life. So relations had to change to keep cotton, tobacco, rice, sugar cane crops flowing and segregation, Jim Crow and other measures to keep African Americans in an inferior place became common in the South, and in the North through limited education, housing, and workplace opportunities. Inferiority of blacks became a self-fulfilling eventuality over generations. But notable and exceptional people caused questions to rise among those who used their heart, minds, body and spirits to live life and grow in wisdom as Christians.

Country of opportunity for all....if fair chances and basic lessons are available to all. And God provided talent gifts of certain kinds may appear in athletic, musical, ingenuity, and comedic format, though talent at humor and comedy may be the gift to those who have lived with the absurd too long. Will privilege, if understood as a matter of chance, something unearned, when referenced and put in a rightful place, allow all people to identify how much our privilege has contributed to results in the journey so far, and how much is owed to that which is a gift at birth? Knowing the story of your family and listening to that of others will lead to connections of universal experiences by humans that transcend skin color. Now how do we address this gift or privilege in living out our years? Do we call upon the Spirit daily in prayer for grace and wisdom? Time will tell.

Dear Honorable Board Members:

You will recall that at the July 18, 2017 WPCA Board meeting, the Board:

- discussed the possibility of amending the Non-discharge Adjustment contained in Section 13.04.330 of the Municipal Code of Ordinances to include residential customers as well as the currently permitted commercial, industrial and institutional users; and
- voted to refer the matter to the City Attorney's Office to propose an amendment to the Code of Ordinances to permit the non-discharge adjustment be extended to residential customers.

Pursuant to your request, the City Attorney's Office proposes the following resolution for consideration at the September 19th WPCA Board meeting:

RESOLUTION

Whereas, the Bridgeport Code of Ordinances, does not currently authorize the WPCA to provide for a billing allowance for residential customers for metered water not discharged into the City's sewage system;

Now Therefore Be It Resolved: That the WPCA does hereby refer to the Bridgeport City Council the matter of whether to amend Section 13.04.330 of the Code of Ordinances to provide

authority to the WPCA to provide for a policy / procedure for allowance of residential customers to install a secondary meter for outdoor watering (lawn irrigation).

Be It Further Resolved: That in order to assist the City Council in its deliberations regarding this matter, the WPCA hereby proposes consideration of a new subsection B. to be added to the conclusion of Section 13.04.330 of the Code of Ordinances (set forth below) in the event the City Council determines to act favorably on this matter.

Bridgeport Code of Ordinances, Title 13 - Public Services

13.04.330 - Allowance for metered water not discharged into the city's sanitary sewer system.

A. Any commercial, industrial or institutional customer using a metered supply of water that is not discharged into the sanitary sewer system may petition the general manager for a billing adjustment provided that: such customer undertake, at its own expense, an engineering study to be performed by an engineer licensed in the state of Connecticut, the results of which shall be turned over to the general manager, indicating the volume of metered water consumed that is not returned to the sanitary sewer system. As an alternative to the aforementioned, such customer may install, at its own expense, a submeter, approved by the general manager, to measure flow into the sanitary sewer system. Such submeter shall be subject to periodic inspection by the WPCA to ensure its proper operation.

B. The WPCA is authorized in its discretion to establish procedures and fees to permit residential customers connected to the sewage system to install a secondary meter for outdoor watering (lawn irrigation). The supply of water recorded on such secondary meter that is not discharged into the sanitary sewer system will not be billed as part of a periodic charge per residential dwelling unit based upon water consumption.





PROJECT SUMMARY/DESCRIPTION: The City of Bridgeport's Parks Department seeks funding from the Connecticut Institute for Resilience and Climate Adaptation (CIRCA) to support its Mirror Lake Coastal Wetland Restoration Project. The project will result in a conceptual design for the renovation of the manmade Mirror Lake area within Seaside Park (currently cut off from Long Island Sound by the berm beneath Soundview Drive) back into an historic coastal wetland and public park connected to the Sound. The project will ultimately improve Seaside Park's ability to protect the South End neighborhood from storm surge and inundation following incidents of sea level rise.

SEASIDE PARK DIAMOND #1 LICENSING AGREEMENT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the University of Bridgeport ("UB") desires to improve and use Diamond #1 at Seaside Park for its baseball team; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bridgeport ("City") agrees to allow UB to use Diamond #1 as desired pursuant to the Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Parties agree to share the cost of making Diamond #1 NCAA compliant as UB will match the City's expenditure on a 2:1 basis up to a total of \$600,000 on UB's part with a maximum contribution in the amount of \$300,000 from the City; and

WHEREAS, in consideration for the aforementioned expenditures, the City will grant UB a license to use Diamond #1 for baseball practices and games from February 1 through May 1 (or longer in the case that the Team qualifies for the NCAA playoffs); and

WHEREAS, the Agreement shall commence when executed and continue for a period of 15 years unless otherwise terminated with the option to extend for an additional 15 years; and

WHEREAS, the effectiveness of this Agreement is contingent upon the availability of funding; and

WHEREAS, the conceptual site plan for the reconstruction of Diamond #1 was unanimously approved by the Parks Board on July 11, 2017.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, BY THE City Council:

- 1. That it is cognizant of the City's plans to allow UB to use and improve Diamond #1 at Seaside Park.
- 2. That it hereby authorizes, directs and empowers the Mayor or his designee, the Director of Public Facilities, to execute such Licensing Agreement and other documents as may be necessary to facilitate the use and improvement of Diamond #1 to a NCAA compliant baseball field.

LICENSING AGREEMENT

BETWEEN
UNIVERSITY OF BRIDGEPORT
AND
CITY OF BRIDGEPORT
AND ITS
BOARD OF PARKS COMMISSIONERS

This agreement ("Agreement") is entered into between the City of Bridgeport, the Board of Park Commissioners, acting through the Department of Public Facilities of the City of Bridgeport, having an address at Margaret E. Morton Government Center, 999 Broad Street, 2nd Floor, Bridgeport, CT 06604 ("City") and the University of Bridgeport, a private university organized under the laws of the State of Connecticut, having an address at 126 Park Avenue, Bridgeport, CT 06605 ("UB") with respect to making physical improvements to the baseball field at Seaside Park shown on Exhibit 1 attached hereto (the field, together with the surrounding area, hereafter described as "Diamond #1") to install an NCAA-compliant baseball field which UB will utilize for the limited number of months each year for practices/games for its NCAA men's baseball team ("Team") while allowing unrestricted use to the City at all other times.

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, each received by the other, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>License to Use the Diamond</u>. In consideration for expenditures (as defined below) toward agreed improvements to Diamond #1, as reflected in Exhibit 1, together with annual preseason maintenance and in-season grooming as set forth below, the City grants a license to UB to use Diamond #1 for Team baseball practices and games from February 1 through May 1 (or longer in the case that the Team qualifies for NCAA playoffs) and during the Fall semester (collectively hereafter referred to as the "Season") of each year during the Term (defined below).
- 2. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall commence upon signing and continue for a period of fifteen (15) years ("Term"), unless sooner terminated by either party as set forth herein.
- a. Extension Option. Either Party shall have the right to renew the Term for an additional fifteen (15) years upon providing the other Party with notice of its intent to renew within three hundred sixty five (365) days of the expiration of the Term.
- 3. <u>Improvements</u>. (a.) Both parties agree to contribute monetary payments and/or material or services of value (hereafter "expenditures") to accomplish the agreed upon improvements reflected in Exhibit 1 to Diamond #1 in a accordance with a mutually agreed upon Budget and schedule. UB will match the City's expenditures on a 2:1 basis up to a total expenditure of \$600,000 on UB's part. (b.) The improvements shall be NCAA compliant. (c.) UB shall supervise the improvements in collaboration with City. (d.) As funding permits, UB will continue to improve Diamond #1 and it agrees to obtain prior written approval from the City for any and all improvements beyond those specified in Exhibit 1.

4. Maintenance.

- (a.) UB agrees to maintain all playing surfaces year-round, secure the fence and UB campus security will patrol the area while in use by UB.
- (b.) City agrees to maintain the areas around the playing field and to remove litter and leaves.
- (c.) City shall retain general responsibility for safety inspection, off-season care and maintenance of Diamond #1, including providing appropriate security. For the purposes of this provision, security shall include securing the fence around the field during UB's off-season and providing the same level and manner of security generally provided by the City in all parks.
- (d.) Capital Reserve Account means a jointly-owned bank account established for the deposit of funds to be used for repair and maintenance expenses in excess of \$5,000 that are not covered by insurance. No expenditure shall be made out of the Capital Reserve Account without the expressed written consent of both Parties.
- (i) The Capital Reserve Account Contribution(s) means the initial contribution of \$5,000 by each party in the Capital Reserve Account, to be deposited into the joint bank account for the first five (5) years during the Term up to a maximum of \$50,000, after which the Parties shall make equal annual contributions to maintain the account at such funding levels. At the termination and/or expiration of this Agreement the Parties shall evenly split the funds remaining in the Capital Reserve Account.
- 5. <u>Scheduling</u>. In order to facilitate and coordinate scheduling events at the Diamond #1, the parties agree to meet in August or September of each year during the Term. UB shall have priority during the Season and City may schedule events during other times of the year when UB is not using Diamond #1.
- 6. <u>Liability and Insurance.</u> (a.) UB shall be responsible for any and all claims arising out of or relating to its use of Diamond #1 and shall indemnify and hold the City harmless from any such claims. (b.) City shall be responsible for any and all claims arising out o for relating to Diamond #1 except when UB is using the facility and shall indemnify and hold the UB harmless from any such claims. (c.) Both parties shall arrange reasonable general liability insurance coverage or shall provide evidence of self-insurance. Specifically, UB shall insure the improvements to Diamond #1, name the City as an additional insured by certificate and policy endorsement and provide proof thereof.
- 7. <u>Disputes</u>. All disputes, if they cannot be resolved amicably at a staff level, shall be resolved by a meeting, called by a party on fifteen (15) days prior written notice, among the City's Mayor, the Chairman of the Board of Parks Commissioners, and the President of UB, or their respective designees. If the parties cannot come to agreement within thirty (30) days after such meeting is called, whether or not the meeting is held, any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this agreement, or the breach thereof, shall be resolved in a court of competent jurisdiction over the parties located in Fairfield County.

- 8. <u>Termination</u>. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause upon a minimum of 365 days written notice to the other party, provided that if the City elects to terminate the Agreement without cause during the Term it shall first reimburse UB for the unamortized portion of UB expenditures paid pursuant to this Agreement based upon the unexpired portion of the Term as of the Termination Date.
- 9. <u>Notice</u>. Any notice desired or required to be given hereunder shall be given in writing and shall be either hand-delivered, delivered by overnight courier service, or shall be mailed in a post-paid envelope addressed to the other party and deposited in a mailbox operated by the United States Postal Service to the following addresses:

- 10. Non-discrimination.
- (a.) UB shall not discriminate or permit discrimination against any person or group of persons on the grounds of race, color, religious creed, age, sexual orientation, marital status, national origin, sex, mental retardation or physical disability, including, but not limited to blindness, in the use of Diamond #1 or any improvements to be erected thereon, and shall not effect or execute any agreement, lease, conveyance, or other instrument whereby Diamond #1 or any part thereof is restricted on the basis of race, color, religious creed, age, sexual orientation, marital status, national origin, sex, mental retardation or physical disability, including, but not limited to blindness, in the use thereof. UB shall comply with all state, and local laws, in effect from time to time, prohibiting discrimination or segregation by reason of race, color, religious creed, age, sexual orientation, marital status, national origin, sex, mental retardation or physical disability, including, but not limited to, blindness, in the use of Diamond #1.

This agreement requires the approval of the Board of Parks Commissioners and the Bridgeport City Council and shall become effective upon delivery of a fully-executed original to UB.





LOCATION MAP



Dear Chief Thode:

I am writing to memorialize that on Friday, February 24, 2017 in my capacity as Mayor and pursuant to the authority vested in me under Bridgeport City Charter, Chapter 17, 4 (b) (7), I appointed you as Fire Chief for the City of Bridgeport, Connecticut ("City") to serve a five (5) year term commencing that same date.

The position of Fire Chief is not affiliated with any collective bargaining unit; and in accordance with Bridgeport Code of Ordinances § 2.36.010 Officers' Salaries your initial annual salary for this appointment was set initially at \$135,000; to be increased to the top of the ordinance salary range for the positon; that is, one-hundred forty-five thousand, four-hundred and twenty-eight dollars (\$145,428) effective as of July 1, 2017. In addition, during the term of your appointment you are entitled to all increases for cost of living as provided for in Ordinance § 2.36.010. Fire Chief is a bona fide executive position. Therefore, you are exempt from entitlement to any overtime pay and are not eligible for compensatory time either to be used for leave or to be accumulated and paid out upon separation from service.

As Fire Chief, you are subject to and shall abide by, all pertinent state and federal statutes and regulations, as well as City charter and code of ordinances and City and departmental official policies, procedures, rules and regulations. As a twenty (20) plus hour per week employee, you are entitled to receive the standard employee benefits granted to the City's unaffiliated class. Included in this benefits package are the following:

- longevity pay at the rate of \$75 per years of service (to be calculated based upon your initial hiring date with the City's Fire Department);
- vacation, sick, personal, holiday and bereavement leave time in accordance with those provided to other unaffiliated employees of the City;

• health benefits insurance coverage and a term life insurance policy in accordance with those provided to other unaffiliated employees of the City and their spouses and dependents; and short-term/long-term disability insurance in accordance with the City's Policy on Unaffiliated Employee Sick Leave.

It is my understanding you will be continuing as a contributing member of the CT Municipal Employees Retirement Fund ("CMERS"), with both you and the City continuing to make their respective required contributions. In addition, you will continue to be eligible to participate in the City's 457 Deferred Compensation Plan in the same manner as other City employees. Finally, the City will contribute ten percent (10%) of your annual salary to the ICMA Retirement System Plan; and you will be eligible to make additional contributions to the ICMA Plan as consistent with the plan rules and applicable law.

You will be provided with an appropriate take-home motor vehicle in accordance with the City Owned Vehicle Policy; as well as fire-fighting and foul weather gear; and shall receive nine-hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$925) annually as a uniform allowance.

My administration looks forward to continuing to work with you and the outstanding Fire Fighters under your command in building upon the past success of the Bridgeport Fire Department. With your experience, qualifications and proven leadership, I am confident that together we will further improve operational efficiency and enhance public safety, with the goal of providing optimal twenty-first century fire safety services to our entire community.

I pledge my Administration's continued full support and cooperation in partnering with you and the brave and dedicated Fire Fighters under your command. Congratulations and Best Wishes!

The Committee on Ordinances begs leave to report; and recommends for adoption the following resolution:

Item No. *71-16 Consent Calendar

WHEREAS, the City Charter of the City of Bridgeport, Chapter 2 – Officers and Elections, requires that all officers of the city, elected or appointed under the provisions of the charter, shall be residents and registered voters of the City of Bridgeport; and

WHEREAS, there have been allegations raised as to the residency of elected officials in the city in the immediate past; and

WHEREAS, there has been a lapse in the re-appointment of board and/or commission members in recent years, with no re-verification of residency; and

WHEREAS, it is important to city residents to trust that each elected or appointed officer of the city resides in the city or appropriate district during their entire term of office or service; and

WHEREAS, such information is regularly provided to the public by comparable Connecticut municipalities; Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED: By the City Council of the City of Bridgeport that the Bridgeport Municipal Code of Ordinances, Chapter 2.02 – Administrative Regulations Generally, is hereby amended to add new Section 2.02.080 – Residency reporting of all municipal elected officials, board and commission members as follows:

(NEW)

2.02.080 Residency reporting of all municipal elected officials, board and commission members.

All municipal elected officers, as well as board and commission members (mayoral appointed or otherwise), are required to provide their current residence street address of record to the town clerk's office by January 31st of each year of service. Any change of residence address during service as an elected officer or board member must be reported to the town clerk's office within 30 days of such residency change.

BE IT ORDAINED: By the City Council of the City of Bridgeport that the Bridgeport Municipal Code of Ordinances, Chapter 3.70 – Event Admissions Surcharge, is hereby amended to add new Section 3.70.015 – Exemption, as follows:

Sections:

3.70.010 - Imposition of surcharge.

There is hereby imposed a surcharge of five percent of the admission charge to any place of amusement, entertainment or recreation within the City of Bridgeport, as defined in subsection (3) of Section 12-540 of the Connecticut General Statutes, except when the admissions charge is not more than ten dollars (\$10.00). The amount of any such surcharge shall be in addition to any tax otherwise applicable to such admission charge, except that no surcharge shall be imposed on a facility if (1) there is imposed a surcharge on such facility pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 12-579, or (2) all of the proceeds from the event inure exclusively to an entity which is exempt from federal income tax under the Internal Revenue Code, provided such entity actively engages in and assumes the financial risk associated with the presentation of such event.

The surcharge shall be imposed on the facility at which such event takes place, and reimbursement for the surcharge shall be collected from the purchaser upon payment of the admission charge. The surcharge, when added to the admission charge, shall be a debt from the purchaser to the facility and shall be recoverable at law. The facility shall remit the total amount of all surcharges imposed pursuant to this section to the Tax Collector in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes Section 12-581. Any surcharge imposed shall be subject to the provisions of Connecticut General Statutes Chapter 226a in the same manner as a tax imposed pursuant to said chapter.

In addition, there shall be added interest at the rate of one and one-half percent per month from the date of the return until date of payment. The tax collector, if satisfied that the failure to comply with any provision of this section was due to reasonable cause, may abate or remit the whole or part of any penalty.

Any taxpayer aggrieved because of any order, decision, determination or disallowance of the tax collector under the provisions of this chapter may, within one month after service upon the taxpayer of notice of such order, decision, determination or disallowance, take an appeal there from to the superior court for the judicial district in which such municipality is located, which shall be accompanied by a citation to such tax collector to appear before such court. Such citation shall be signed by the same authority, and such appeal shall be returnable at the same time and served and

If the appeal has been taken without probable cause, the court may tax double or triple costs, as the case demands; and, upon all such appeals which may be denied, costs may be taxed against the appellant at the discretion of the court, but no costs shall be taxed against the city.

WHEREAS, the City of Bridgeport's current Chapter 8.88 of the Bridgeport Municipal Code of Ordinances has been in effect and unamended since 1992; and

WHEREAS, the City has decided to clarify and simplify the Chapter on Municipal Clinics to better comport with certain state requirements; Now, Therefore,

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED: By the City Council of the City of Bridgeport that the current Chapter 8.88 of the Bridgeport Municipal Code be amended as per the new Chapter 8.88 as attached hereto, and be effective upon publication:

Chapter 8.88 - MUNICIPAL CLINICS

Sections: 8.88.010 - Board of governors - Composition - Terms.

There shall continue to be a public dispensary known as the municipal clinics of the city, which shall be under the management, direction and control of a board of governors of eight five members, at least six of whom shall be physicians medical professionals who have engaged in the actual practice of their profession in the city for a period of at least three years. The members of such board shall occupy their office during good behavior, and such board shall fill any vacancy which shall occur in their membership by death, resignation or removal. All appointments shall be made by the mayor subject to the approval of the city council. Members shall be electors of the city holding no salaried municipal office. The director of health and social services and the superintendent of the department of public welfare shall be ex officio members of such board. The members of the board shall have the right to vote, with the exception of the director of health and social services, who shall serve ex officio. The director of public health and social services may designate a person to serve in his or her absence.

Members of the board of governors shall be appointed for terms of three years, except that of those first appointed, one shall be appointed for a term ending December 31, 2017, two for a term ending December 31, 2018 and two for a term ending December 31, 2019. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.

8.88.020 - Board of governors - Officers.

The board of governors of the municipal clinics shall annually elect from its members a president and a secretary. It shall be the duty of the secretary to keep an accurate record of the proceedings of the board.

8.88.030 - Board of governors, Clinic Administrator - Duties.

The board of governors of the municipal clinics shall maintain and conduct the emergency hospital and such <u>outpatient</u> clinics as it may determine <u>and in accordance with state laws and regulations governing licensed outpatient clinics operated by municipalities. The activities of the board, except as to emergency work, shall be confined to the dependent and semidependent classes of the city and shall include the assumption of the duties imposed upon selectment by statute relative to the medical treatment of paupers insofar as such treatment may be provided within such clinics. Such board shall cooperate with the department of health and social services in the physical and mental examination of such other persons as may be agreed upon by such boards.</u>

The board of governors, as a minimum, shall: (1) Adoption of bylaws or their equivalent, rules and regulations or their equivalent, including medical staff bylaws, or both; (2) annual appointment of the medical staff with annual designation of medical director; and (3) appointment of a clinic administrator, qualified on the basis of training and experience approved by the commissioner of public health.

The clinic administrator, or the equivalent, shall be responsible to the governing board for the management and operation of the clinic and for the employment of personnel. The administrator shall attend meetings of the governing board and meetings of the professional staff.

Personnel shall be employed in sufficient numbers and of adequate qualifications so that the function of the clinic may be performed efficiently.

The board of public welfare shall lend all assistance to the board of governors of the municipal clinics when possible and shall provide such material relief in food, diets, fuel and rent as may be necessary in the judgment of the board of governors to supplement its medical and social treatment to the end that practical benefit to patients may be effected; provided, however, that nothing in this section shall obligate the board of public welfare to furnish aid to any individual not legally entitled thereto. **REPEAL**

8.88.040 - Professional Staff.

There shall be an organized professional staff of not fewer than three members of the major profession or professions providing care in the clinic. The professional staff shall adopt written rules and regulations governing its own activities, subject to approval of the governing board of the clinic. As a minimum these shall include:

- (1) methods of control of privileges granted to members of the medical staff and the responsibilities of the medical director;
- (2) method of professional supervision of clinical work;
- (3) provision for regular staff meetings;
- (4) preparation of adequate case records; and
- (5) procedure for recommending appointment to the staff and for hearing complaints regarding the conduct of members, referring the same, with recommendations, to the governing board.

8.88.050 - Construction of chapter.

Nothing in this chapter shall be construed so as to conflict with the powers and duties of the department of health and social services or the board of public welfare as defined by the statutes of the state and the charter of the city, and the board of governors of the municipal clinics shall strictly comply with the authorized rules and regulations of the department of health and services.
