Council President Nieves welcomed everyone to the public speaking session, read the rules for public speaking, and noted that comments are to be civil and respectful of all those in attendance, and must adhere to the three-minute time limit.

City of Bridgeport City Council Meeting Regular Meeting April 15, 2024 .John Marshall Lee addressed the Council and excerpts of his statement are as follows:

Where does oversight come in. After 911 the phase 'See something, say something' took shape and now freedom of faith, ability to speak and gather freely, right to vote, or participate in governance activities like speaking to a City Council factor into this assessment of personal democratic liberties? They should do something? Where do you go to find facts and information to get the truth about taxes, budgets, schools, and important health and safety issues? Who keeps record of practices? Where do we hold community conversations, where people seek a place at the table, to be respected, welcomed, and listened to in turn so that all may learn with a right to speak in turn? Time will tell.

Deborah Boles addressed the Council and excerpts of her statement are as follows

"Any portrayal of the resolution as a "collaborative effort" is simply false. This 'meeting' was nothing more than a manipulative scheme to enable the council members who pushed the resolution to claim that they worked cooperatively with the Jewish community - a claim that was dishonestly reported to the press and has been repeated by numerous parties since then."

To repeat: our clergy was used. When it was shown that no collaboration took place, this council did nothing to remedy the situation.

How would you like it if your personal Priest, Minister, Pastor, Imam was used like that? The Mayor and City Council owes the Jewish Community, Rabbi Landa and Rabbi Schultz both public and written apologies. Was this defamation of two Rabbis and a religious-based community? Was this done out of hatred or just old-fashioned antisemitism?

I know you want this to go away - but without public, written, and private apologies to the Rabbis and to the

Judith Shapiro

My name is Judith Shapiro, and I am a member of the Jewish Federation of Fairfield County, 4200 Park Avenue, Bridgeport, CT.

I would like to thank the four City Council members who on April 1st voted to rescind the Gaza ceasefire resolution. Thank you also to the members who stressed that this was a lost opportunity to bring opposing sides together. And I was moved by the members who expressed their wish that some official group had called for a ceasefire when their people were being persecuted.

Ceasefires are intended to bring an end to the killing that takes place in war. In the Middle East, however, they tend merely to provide a respite between wars. This is especially true of Hamas, who used a ceasefire in place on October 7, 2023, to launch a surprise attack on Israel, raping, butchering, and burning their way through peaceful farm villages – and then taking 250 hostages, in some cases entire families, back to Gaza. Back to the brutal war machine that Hamas has designed to put civilians on the war's front lines.

And why? Why all the horrible carnage? I found the answer right here while attending Bridgeport City Council meetings. I cannot describe what it was like to hear the slogan, "From the River to the Sea" repeated over and over, and realize that those chanting it were advocating for the destruction of the state of Israel with its 9 million Jewish, Muslim, Christian, Druze, and Bahai citizens.

For that is Hamas' goal, as declared in their founding document, specifically Article 13: "Initiatives and so-called peaceful solutions and international conferences, are in contradiction to the principles of the Islamic Resistance Movement ... There is no solution for the Palestinian question except through Jihad."

I have been a taxpayer here for over 20 years and I'd like to know whose duty it is to protect the taxpayers of the city, from unnecessary and avoidable financial liabilities. Some financial liabilities that I know first hand are being created due to the actions of Chief Porter abusing his role as Police Chief.

My complaint alleging the disparity, abuse of power and malfeasance of Chief Roderick Porter was sent on 01/04 and 04/08/24 to Mayor Ganim, CAO Gaudett, City Attorneys, Labor relations and then Internal Affairs. Not one single office has returned a call to inquire as to the validity of my accusations.

City Charter, Chapter 2 Sec. 17-(Removal of Certain Officers)

By being made aware of this alleged malfeasance, at the very least, someone within the city should have both an interest and obligation to investigate the facts surrounding these serious claims of blatant misconduct, abuse of power and the intent to cause harm by Chief Porter.

City Charter, Chapter 13-(Police),

Chief Porter has failed to faithfully and impartially execute the duties of his role as Chief of Police. Directives, Policies and procedures have been disregarded and his operation and acts in utilizing policies are also blatantly inconsistent with past practice which is a matter of public record.

I ask that there be accountability as there must be fair and impartial treatment of all officers based on policies and without personal vendettas at the hands of Chief Porter.

Bridgeport should be proud that a ceasefire resolution was passed. I commend Councilmember Melendez and all those who support bringing peace to Gaza. As some council members stated,

Thankfully the motion to rescind was unsuccessful and no evidence was brought forward to show that anything improper occurred. The full council should accept that tonight. I hope that the Israeli hostages are returned safely. I hope that the thousands of kidnapped Palestinians in Israeli prisons are freed as well, many of whom Amnesty Int'l and Human Rights Watch confirm are held without charges and are victims of humiliation, torture, and beatings. I am energized as I witness people exercising their First Amendment right to speak up for those in another land who are asking the world to let their truth be known.

Mohammad Hamada addressed the Council and excerpts of his statements are as follows:

10 city council meetings, over 90 Gazza ceasefire speeches. I'm going to recap them all for you in three questions:

- Did the Bridgeport city council have the right to pass a resolution calling for a ceasefire in Gazza? Absolutely, YES
 - · Over 100 cities in the United States have passed ceasefire resolutions including:
 - o Albany, Atlanta, Chicago, Minneapolis, San Francisco, Seattle, Iowa City
 - Even a small town like Newfane, Vt., with a population 1,645 people has passed a
 ceasefire resolution. Anyone who thinks a small town in Vermont with 1,600
 people has more weight than the largest and most diverse city in Connecticut,
 should be ashamed of themselves.
 - Overwhelming majority of city council members including the one member who flipped her vote under pressure have already stated that they have an obligation to the Bridgeport community and that the resolution sends a message to the White and federal legislators to call for a cease fire.
 - Lastly, it's crucial to emphasize that the ceasefire resolution isn't about politics or
 foreign policy; it's purely humanitarian. We did not ask you to pass a resolution on the
 conflicts between India and Pakistan over Kashmir. We asked you to pass a resolution
 calling on the Zionist president of the United States to stop the atrocities the are killing
 tens of thousands of innocent men, women and children funded by our tax collars.

Jonathan Maclay addressed the Council and excerpts of his statement are as follows:

I am a resident at 1188 Main St, commonly known as The Lofts, and I have been living there since 9/1/2023. I am here today to talk about loud music coming from 1211 Main St, The Hollywood Hookah Lounge.

After moving to The Lofts during Labor Day weekend, I noticed loud music coming from the club until 3am. I later found out that the club is open Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays and plays loud music every night it's open. I'm not sure if the club gets smoky and that's why they open the door but when they do again the entire street and its neighbors can hear it until 3am.

I only called 911 twice about the music since September about and one time nothing was done. The other time, I think a patrol car was dispatched and sent to the club and the music stopped. The 911 dispatcher did tell me that they get many 911 calls about the club.

I am asking if the Bridgeport City Council could make an ordinance that would prohibit loud music to be played after 1am on Thursday and Sunday nights since Friday and Monday's are work days. For your consideration.

Deborah Weiss addressed the Council, excerpts of her statement are as follows:

Mayor Ganim to the press about the approved resolution: "Even in a small place like Bridgeport, a loud voice of Muslim and Jewish leaders who come together and say we want to end the violence. It's a very important statement." However, his statement was false. Here is the truth from Rabbi Schultz, Bnai Israel, about what actually occurred on January 2nd at the Bridgeport City Council meeting.

While attending the meeting, Tom Gaudett, Ganim's Deputy chief-of-staff, approached us asking that we leave the public audience. He led the two of us and five members of the Muslim community into a private room. Soon after we entered the room, Ganim, President Nieves, and council members entered, We did not request this meeting, nor have any advance knowledge.

When asked if we were comfortable with the language of the proposed "ceasefire resolution," we replied that the language was problematic and the resolution was one-sided and flawed; we stressed the Jewish community's lack of prior knowledge about the resolution, urging that it be tabled to allow for meaningful input. We made it clear that we couldn't represent the entire Jewish community; were vastly outnumbered, pressured to provide immediate input, and continually interrupted. The members of the Islamic

Today, we stand witness to yet another tragic chapter in the ongoing conflict in Gaza. As we gather here, it is imperative that we raise our voices and call for an immediate ceasefire. First and foremost, let us remember the human cost of this conflict.



FAIRFIELD COUNTY BLUE PLAN

WHEREAS, the Fairfield County Mutual Law Enforcement Aid Plan (Fairfield County Blue Plan) (the "Mutual Aid Plan") is designed to coordinate law enforcement resources in response to significant incidents within Fairfield County, aiming to provide comprehensive yet easily deployable assistance to agencies, ensuring effective incident management within a reasonable timeframe while minimizing unnecessary resource self-dispatching;

WHEREAS, the City of Bridgeport Police Department has previously engaged as a participant in the mutual aid police assistance compact for Fairfield County;

WHEREAS, participating municipalities in the Mutual Aid Plan include Bethel, Brookfield, Danbury, Darien, Easton, Fairfield, Greenwich, Monroe, New Canaan, New Fairfield, Newtown, Norwalk, Shelton, Stamford, Stratford, Redding, Ridgefield, Trumbull, Western Connecticut State University, Westport, Weston, Wilton, and Bridgeport;

WHEREAS, the City of Bridgeport Police Department seeks to continue its involvement in the Mutual Aid Plan with all police agencies in Fairfield County, which facilitates mutual aid between nearly all local law enforcement agencies in Fairfield County;

WHEREAS, the Fairfield County Mutual Police Assistance Compact (the "Compact") promotes regional cooperation among law enforcement agencies and establishes protocols for activation when these Mutual Aid Plans are required; and

WHEREAS, in order for the City of Bridgeport to remain a participant in the Mutual Aid Plan, its Chief Executive Officer and Chief of Police, or designee, must sign the Compact.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRIDGEPORT THAT

The City Council approves the Fairfield County Mutual Law Enforcement Aid Plan (Fairfield County Blue Plan), replacing all prior Mutual Aid Plans. The Mayor is authorized to sign the attached Mutual Police Assistance Compact and any subsequent extensions. Additionally, the Mayor may execute other necessary documents pertaining to this matter, subject to review and approval by the Office of the City Attorney.

WHEREAS, Title 7-277a, Title 10a-156b(f), and Title 7-148cc of the Connecticut General Statutes authorize municipalities and institutions to enter into agreements for mutual police assistance and

WHEREAS, the undersigned municipalities/institutions find that general and emergency law enforcement needs can best be served by the creation of a regional approach to law enforcement, resulting in better coordination and less duplication in law enforcement efforts and;

WHEREAS, the undersigned municipalities/institutions find that a Mutual Police Assistance Compact is necessary in order to protect the safety and well-being of the respective municipalities/institutions and

WHEREAS, the undersigned municipalities/institutions wish to cooperate on mutual police assistance in furtherance of these goals under the terms of this compact;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed by and among the undersigned municipalities/institutions, by their respective chief executive officers duly authorized, to the following:

ARTICLE ONE: Provision of Personnel and Equipment

- The chief executive officers of the undersigned municipalities/institutions hereby delegate to the chiefs of police of their respective municipalities/institutions the authority to determine when the provision of police personnel and equipment best serves the purposes of this compact.
- It is anticipated that personnel and equipment will be deployed pursuant to this compact in order to respond to routine operational calls for assistance and/or unique mutual aid teams with undertakings relative to public safety operations.
- All such requests shall be made to the chief of police (or designee) of the municipality/institution
 from which assistance is sought. Each such request shall be logged by the sending and
 requesting municipality/institution.
- 4. Any municipality/institution providing assistance pursuant to this compact shall record the names and time of dispatch of all personnel assigned in response to a request for assistance. All such records shall be furnished to the receiving municipality/institution upon request.
- During the deployment of personnel and equipment pursuant to this compact, the officers so
 deployed shall have the same powers, duties, privileges, and immunities as are conferred on the
 police officers of the municipality/institution requesting assistance.
- 6. During a request for assistance, the undersigned municipalities/institutions will provide available law enforcement personnel as they determine appropriate and reasonable, given their own staffing availability. Upon activating the "Fairfield County Blue Plan," municipalities will provide law enforcement personnel per that Plan.

- Personnel assigned by their respective department to a deployment pursuant to this compact shall
 respond to the location to which they have been requested and place themselves under the
 direction of such requesting municipality's supervising officer. They shall assist as necessary
 and appropriate, consistent with direction, in accordance with the law, as well as their own
 Department's rules of conduct.
- 2. Each officer deployed pursuant to this compact shall wear their own regular department uniform, except when the nature of the assignment requires otherwise.
- All non-custodial arrests made pursuant to this compact shall be processed by the officer issuing
 the citation and summons. All custodial arrests shall be processed in the jurisdiction in which
 the arrest is made.

ARTICLE THREE: Reimbursement and Liability

- Each participating municipality/institution agrees that it shall be responsible for all of its own
 costs which have been incurred in providing assistance under this compact, whether that
 municipality's equipment and personnel were operating within or without its own jurisdiction.
 Such costs may include but are not limited to:
 - o Damage incurred to vehicles, clothing, and equipment;
 - Awards for death, disability, or injury to personnel to the extent that such awards exceed Worker's Compensation coverage;
 - Worker's Compensation claims as set forth in C.G.S. 31-275 et seq.;
 - o Survivor's benefits as set forth in C.G.S. 7-323e;
- 2. Each party shall remain liable for the defense, settlement, and/or judgment arising from any and all claims by third parties for property damage and personal injury (including death) which have arisen or are alleged to have arisen out of that party's conduct under the agreement, whether the alleged tortuous act took place within or without the party's respective jurisdiction.
- 3. The services performed, and expenditures made under this agreement shall be deemed for public and governmental purposes, and all immunities from liability enjoyed by the local government within its boundaries shall extend to its participation in rendering emergency service outside its boundaries.
- 4. In the event that outside funding becomes available to pay for the expenses of the municipalities/institution operating under any part of this compact, such funds shall be allocated among the participating municipalities/institution on a proportional cost basis, i.e., the same ratio as any municipality's expenses bear to the total cost of the services provided hereunder.
- 5. Each municipality/institution shall be responsible for ensuring that each deploying officer is currently certified by POST or CSP and is in good standing.

ARTICLE FOUR: Miscellaneous

- Participation in this compact does not bind any municipality/institution to provide assistance to any specific request for a deployment except as agreed upon with the Fairfield County Blue Plan.
- 2. The chiefs of police (or designee) of the municipalities/institution providing assistance may at any time recall any personnel or equipment provided pursuant to this compact.
- 3. In accordance with CGS 7-277a, each chief of police (or designee) that requests or provides assistance pursuant to this compact shall inform the chief executive officer of the

- municipality/institution served by such chief (or designee) of such request or provision of assistance.
- 4. Withdrawal from this compact by any municipality hereto shall be made by written notice to all other municipalities/institutions and shall not terminate the compact among the remaining municipalities.

Effective Date and Term

- This Agreement shall be in effect when fully executed by two or more municipalities/institution's Chief Executive Officer and Head Law Enforcement Officer of any of the participating municipalities/institutions.
- 2. This Agreement shall remain in force provided two or more participating municipalities/institutions exist. If a municipality/institution wishes to withdraw, it shall provide written notice of its intent to withdraw from the Agreement. Such notification shall state the effective termination date and be addressed to the Fairfield County Chiefs of Police Association Executive Board.

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Overview

The Fairfield County Blue Plan (FCBP) has been developed in order to coordinate law enforcement resources responding to any major incident within Fairfield County. This plan is comprehensive in scope yet easy to deploy when needed. The goal of this plan is to ensure agencies needing assistance receive the level of response necessary to effectively manage the incident within a reasonable time, while alleviating the self-dispatching of unnecessary resources.

Understanding the importance of having a standardized mutual aid plan in place, the Fairfield County Chief of Police Association in conjunction with DEMHS Region 1 and Region 5 have developed this contemporary mutual aid plan. This plan was adopted off of the Capitol Region Blue Plan that has been in place and has proven successful. The Blue Plan is designed to simplify and standardize mutual aid response to other municipalities.

The plan is specifically tailored to each municipality in Fairfield County and has three levels, 1, 2, and 3. Each level represents a geographical area around the town in need. As the need for addition law enforcement officers' increases, so does the level/geographical area which is proportionate to the number of officers. In summary each level will supply the agency in need with 10 additional officers.

When the FCBP is activated and mutual aid agencies are in route, the incident Command System will be utilized to manage the incoming support. Hence ICS 100 and 700 courses are recommended for all Fairfield County law enforcement officers and dispatchers.

The FCBP also recognizes the difficulties that can be faced by smaller agencies with limited dispatch resources. Some towns may have only one dispatcher on duty and a large event may have the potential to overwhelm the dispatcher. With this in mind, the Blue Plan incorporates a hand off activation allowing the smaller communication centers to focus on the emergency. Norwalk Police Department and the Danbury Police Department have agreed to be designated hand off agencies.

When reviewing the FCBP for your individual department, you will see the break down in mutual aid response for each of the three levels. Each level of response represents a predetermined geographical ring providing 10 additional officers per level to your town.

Activation

The municipality activating the plan will decide on the level of response required depending upon the incident and the mutual aid assistance required.

The municipality will refer to their specific part of the plan for the resources to be requested.

The activation of the FCBP will be conducted over FAPERN (and simulcast on the State Police Hotline if available). Use of FAPERN will allow responding units to hear only what is relative to their response. This also allows for the Incident Commander and the Staging Officer to conduct roll call of responding units.

Prior to activation, dispatching staff should have:

- · Nature of incident
- Address of incident
- Address of reporting/staging location (if not determined resources will respond to the requesting municipality's police department)



2024 First Round of City Sidewalk Repair Program List of Repairs

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, numerous sidewalks in the City of Bridgeport ("City") are in varying states of disrepair; and

WHEREAS, the City can be held liable under certain circumstances for injuries which may occur dues to disrepair of sidewalks; and

WHEREAS, the City has the right to force sidewalk repairs and recoup from the homeowner 100% of the costs of the repair; and

WHEREAS, the Administration desires to continue its efforts to make the City a safer place for its citizens and visitors to live and work; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to engage in an aggressive and protective pilot program to have sidewalks repaired; and

WHEREAS, on May 1, 2017, the City Council passed a resolution which stated:

NOW, THEREFORE, in furtherance of the public safety and the need for a City-wide program to repair these sidewalks in a progressive, fair, deliberate manner and in accordance with the available funding, it is hereby RESOLVED by the City Council, in support and approval of the pilot program, that the City proceed with sidewalk repair pilot program and to the extent the City causes participants' sidewalks to be repaired, to absorb fifty (50%) percent of the cost of the same, apply such Senior Citizen and Social Security Disability credits as may be applicable, and should the actual costs NOT exceed 110% of the estimates set forth to the Council in advance, the City Council will approve and accept then filing of the appropriate lien(s) against the respective property(ies), providing, however, the City is not hereby authorized to pursue a foreclosure on a sidewalk repair lien, but rather should await payment from the affected owners, mortgagees, insurance companies, or through a sale of the subject parcel; and

WHEREAS, the approval of the Program was contingent on the Department of Public Facilities causing periodic lists of anticipated sidewalk repairs and estimate costs to be submitted to the Council for permission to lien those parcels in the event that the City causes said repairs to be made and should respective homeowner(s) fail to pay the remaining invoice within thirty (30) days of mailing of the invoice (the City may, prior to completing the repair, work out a payment arrangement with the homeowner as exigencies may require); and

WHEREAS, the City has compiled this list for 2023 which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the approved Sidewalk Repair Pilot Program, it is hereby RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, that the City proceed with the repairs set forth in Exhibit A and it is further RESOLVED that if any of the homeowners participating in the Program fail to pay their fifty (50%) percent within the allotted time and/or fail to work out and adhere to an approved payment schedule, the City Council hereby approves the filing of a lien on those respective parcels for actual cost of repairs, but in no event more than 10% more than the estimates set forth in Exhibit A, but also NOT foreclose or sell such sidewalk repair liens as per the Program's initial approval.
